- You are in your final year of study for your bachelor's degree or within four years of earning your bachelor's degree (Veterans - six years).

- Early August: Application opens
- Early October: Deadline of Knight Hennessy Application
- January: Notification of Finalists
- Late February: Up to 150 finalists invited to Stanford for "Immersion Weekend"
- Mid March: 75 Knight-Hennessy Scholars Announced

- Online Application
- Transcript(s)
- One-page Resume
- Two Recommendation letters
- Essays
- Video Story (Invitation Only)

Resume

- Highlight of your experiences, interests, and academic record in reverse-chronological order
- Include professional and/or extracurricular experiences
- Emphasize leadership, research, and service activities
- Select a font size that ensures your document is legible.

RECOMMENDATIN LETTERS

- Provide specific examples and evidence of your ability and determination to make a difference.
- Separate letter from departmental recommendation letters.
- Focus on Leadership, Service and Commitment to future career goal.
- No institutional endorsement is required.

ESSAYS

- After graduating from Stanford, what are your immediate and long-term intentions? How will your Knight-Hennessy Scholars experience prepare you to realize your intentions? (Limit 250 words)
- Please tell us when and how you: (limit 150 words for all three responses combined)
 - 1. Made someone particularly proud of you
 - 2. Were most challenges
 - 3. Did not meet expectations

ESSAYS

- Please tell us eight improbable facts (things that are unlikely but true) about you. (Limit 150 words for all eight responses combined)
- Connect the dots. How have the influences in your life shaped you? (Limit 600 words)
