

# **UNM Preliminary Deadline: October 1, 2025**

### I. Eligibility

- Be a junior (graduating between December 2026 and August 2027) or a graduating senior if you are graduating within 3 years
- Be a U.S. Citizen
- Have a highly competitive GPA
- Plan to pursue a master's degree in Law, Public Administration, Public Health, Social Work, Education, Public Policy, International Affairs, etc.
- Plan to work in public service for three of the first seven years after I complete a Foundation-funded graduate degree.
- Obtain institutional nomination Submit <u>UNM online Application Form</u>
  NISF.unm.edu → Prestigious Awards → Truman Scholarship → Application Form

#### II. Awards and Benefits

- \$30,000 for graduate degrees in public service fields
- Invitation to Truman Leadership Week
- Assistance with career counseling, internship placement, graduate school admissions, and professional development

# III. Criteria

- Appropriateness for proposed graduate study
- A "Change Agent" in your field
- Selection criteria for Finalists include
  - o extent and quality of community service and/or government involvement
  - leadership record
  - o academic performance, writing and analytical skills and
  - suitability of the nominee's proposed program of study for a career in public service.
- At the interview, Truman scholars are selected largely based on
  - o leadership potential and communication skills
  - o intellectual strength and analytical ability and
  - o likelihood of 'making a difference' in public service.

### IV. Truman Application/Supporting Documents (The CAELD office upload the supporting documents.)

- Online application form
- College/university transcript(s)
- Three letters of recommendation

#### 1. Leadership Potential and Abilities

- a. Confirm and elaborate on the leadership example the candidate described in Question 7 on the Application
- Address the candidate's personal characteristics (confidence, persuasiveness, diligence, conviction, vitality, poise, and so forth) which contribute to the candidate's leadership abilities.

#### 2. Commitment to a Career in Public Service

- a. Confirm and elaborate on the service experience the candidate described in Question 8 on the Application.
- b. Describe a significant contribution made by the candidate through one or more public service, community or government-related activities
- c. Address the candidate's values, interests, goals, and/or ambitions which represent commitment to a career in government or elsewhere in the public service.

# 3. Intellect and Prospects for Continuing Academic Success

a. Discuss the student's overall academic background in context of the student's future plans for career and graduate school

### V. Selection Process

October 1, 2025 (11:59 pm) – UNM Preliminary Application Due October 20, 2025 – UNM Finalists Announced Late October – Early November 2024 – UNM Finalists Interview Early November 2025 – UNM Nominees Announced December 2025 – First Draft Due, Recommenders Confirmation

### Early February 2026 – Truman Application Due

February 2026 – Truman Finalists Announced March or April– Finalist Interview April 2026– Truman Scholars Announced
