UNM Preliminary Deadline: November 18, 2025

I. Eligibility

- Be a sophomore (graduating in May 2028) or junior (graduating in May 2027)
- Be a U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident
- Have a 3.0 GPA or above
- Apply one of the three categories
 1. **Environment:** For undergraduates interested in conservation and environmental issues
 2. **Tribal Policy:** For Native Americans and Alaska Natives working on an array of policy issues in Indian country
 3. **Native Health Care:** For Native Americans and Alaska Natives pursuing health-related careers
- Obtain **institutional nomination**

- Up to \$7,000 for tuition, room/board, and other educational expenses (55 awards)
- Udall scholar orientation during August in Tucson, AZ (Mandatory)

- Research experiences & Leadership skills
- Consistent & long-term record of commitment to the chosen field
- Unusual or innovative suggestions for solutions to problems
- Vision, energy, enthusiasm, interpersonal skills

In 800 words or less, tell us how these three characteristics resonate with you today and how you exemplify at least one of these values in your personal and professional life.”
- College/university transcript(s)
- Three letters of recommendation
 1. a current or recent faculty member in the nominee’s field of study;
 2. an individual who can speak about the nominee’s commitment; and
 3. another individual who can attest to the nominee’s leadership and/or service.

Selected statistics on the 2025 competition (55 Scholars & 55 honorable mentions)

- A total of 381 students were nominated by 175 institutions
- Environment category – 38 scholars selected from 333 applications
- Tribal Policy category – 10 scholars selected from 29 applications

- Sophomore – 12 scholars selected from 121 applications
- Junior – 49 scholars selected from 260 applications
